




SOUTH AFRICA: This has been a highly productive few months. We have traveled hundreds of miles. East from Swaziland for a ministers conference to the Northern Cape of South Africa. In the City of Kuruman, I was privileged to be a part of a baptismal service where 24 were baptized. One of our evangelists, engaged in a revival in the city of Port Elizabeth, reports thirteen being baptized. At Turning Point in Alberton, South Africa, where I am senior pastor, I was privleged to baptize eight new believers in Jesus' name. We have also been busy teaching at the South Africa Bible Institute and helping our general superintendent and area coordinator teach a series of seminars across the country presenting the new vision of the UPC of South Africa. So far, we have taught nearly 150 pastors and local church leaders and have five seminars remaining.—Dan and Sherry Davis

SPAIN: We are in revival here in Madrid. In the last eighteen months that we have pastored this church, we have seen 167 baptized in Jesus' name and 251 receive the Holy Ghost. REGIONAL MISSIONS PROGRAM PALAU: The church is constantly moving forward to expand the kingdom for His glory. At last report, 289 converts have been baptized in Jesus' name, though only 40% of them remain in the island because they are contract workers. Under the church education program, we started our layman's Bible training course second level, and it has gathered 30 active student members with the goal to reach out to the Filipino community in Micronesia West. It is a certificate level program based on classroom hours. We are targeting three fulltime missionaries from our church this year. The construction of a pastoral house with four bedrooms inside the compound of the church is also in progress.
