PAPUA NEW GUINEA: The biggest news of this quarter is also the most exciting. During our recent General Board meeting, the Board interviewed the graduating Bible school students. As one by one came to the Board, they expressed their desire to go as Home Missionaries into our "missions zones." These are under-evangelized areas of PNG where the church has minimal presence.

We were moved greatly by their willingness to leave the known behind and step into the unknown. Some are going where there are no contacts, no relatives and no churches. Even though they are still within the borders of their own country, it is really like they are going to a different world. Papua New Guinea has over 800 languages and sub-cultures! They are taking their families; wives, children and small babies with them, not having a house to move into or knowing what schooling is available, or where finance will come from beyond the initial \$75.00 pocket money that the PNG Missions Department gives them to start with.

Their faith reminded me of the first steps that my family made as we packed up our house, left our worldly possessions behind, and came to Papua New Guinea. An exciting aspect is that one of them has gone to the autonomous region of Bouganville (Buka Island), which is set to become its own independent country in a few years, if all goes well. This means that PNG has almost sent out its first foreign missionary. We are touching the borders of the Solomon Islands! This is a fantastic result for the Bible school and the church here. We are so proud of these fine young men.—**Richard and Andrea Carver**

Matthew and Angie Buckland

Czech Republic



Matthew Buckland, son of missionary Roger and Becky Buckland, became part of the missionary family when his parents were appointed to the Philippines in 1984. Having served two terms, they relocated to start a work in the Czech Republic. After graduating from Indiana Bible College, Matthew returned to the field as an AlMer and taught in Bible schools in Eastern Europe.

He married Angie in 2004 and worked with the youth group of Pasadena, Texas, under the leadership of Brother Glass. While there, he also served as a police chaplain for five years. In 2009, Matthew was elected as the pastor of Calvary United Pentecostal Church in Richmond, Indiana, and served on both the Youth and Sunday School committees. Brother Buckland also earned his Bachelor's degree from Great Lakes University and is currently nearing completion of his Masters of Theology degree from Urshan Graduate School of Theology.

The Bucklands were appointed in September 2013 as missionaries to the Czech Republic and plan to facilitate the Bible school and help nationals plant churches throughout central Europe. Along with them on deputation are their two sons, Grant and Pierce.
