BRAZIL: There is no faster and more solid way to make firm disciples than through a Bible school program with pastors sending their students first to Bible school to be anchored in truth that will hold them through the anti-God currents of our modern day worldwide society. We have been appointed by UPCI since September 1964 and learned quickly that one man alone could not accomplish much in planting the Apostolic message in all of Brazil as we see today. From 1972 to the present, we have operated Bible schools in Brazil called Apostolic Bible Institute (in Portuguese, IBA) and the simplicity of our great truths are held by thousands of believers.



Brother Raymond Woodward from Fredericton, NB, Canada, preached the graduation service where 141 graduates from three ABIs joined with Manaus for a powerful service at our "Jerusalem" Conference Center on the north side of Amazon river, twelve miles east of the city. The following nights were of the Manaus Metro districts annual conference, where about eighty new ministers were presented. A five hundred voice choir blessed the crowd. During altar service on November 16, God baptized 136 with the baptism of the Holy Ghost.
