LIBERIA - We thank God that we were able to travel to the Republic of Guinea, West Africa, for their third annual General Conference. We had an average nightly attendance of approximately 100. We held doctrinal classes for three days and twenty were baptized in Jesus' name while six were Holy Ghost filled. Guinea is a predominantly Muslim nation but have allowed some churches to go in. PROJECT OF THE MONTH: Solar Electricity in Nicaragua

There is a need for the purchase of Solar Electrical Systems for some of the churches in remote mountain or jungle regions of Nicaragua where electricity is currently unavailable.

These systems will provide a renewable source of electricity for the church and parsonage, providing lights, and power for a sound system and musical equipment. The system cost is estimated at approximately \$1,500.00.

A church called "Santa Fe del Caracol" held a three day revival in March of 2011, where twenty-one received the Holy Ghost and several were baptized in a creek. They borrowed a gas generator for the revival, but they would greatly benefit to have their own solar electricity. People walked up to 8 hours one-way to come to this revival.
