Seven of our children just completed the school year and we are so proud of their accomplishments. Most had never been to school before and several actually learned to read. How exciting is that? We survived an outbreak of chicken pox, the mumps, lots of lice, parasites and one broken bone. Not to mention the twentyeight trips to the dentist to repair and clean their teeth. We are thrilled with the changes we have seen in our children. They attend Sunday School in one of our local churches and we hold children's services twice a month as well as learning their weekly memory verses. They are learning so much about the love of the Lord. It is so sweet to hear them singing worship songs and skipping about the property.— Lynne Jewett

REUNION: Last September we were blessed to attend the East African sub-regional meeting held in Madagascar in concordance with the Madagascar National Conference. Twelve countries were represented with missionaries and nationals in attendance. During the conference 2,232 received the Holy Ghost and 118 were baptized in Jesus' name. We were missionaries in Madagascar for sixteen years and transferred to the Islands in 1993 where we continue working today. We were thankful to visit with family,


