BRAZIL: Trained Bible school youth go everywhere and we struggle to keep up with visits. We are very glad to see this point of growth. Without the seaplanes we would be unable to reach many areas in northwest Brazil's huge rain forest. Flying fifty hours in six weeks in our Cessna 206 seaplane, I was able to visit rural areas such as Acre, Pará, Roraima, and Amazonas states. The day usually starts by rolling out of a

h a m m o c k, eating breakfast, flying to the next place, mooring the sea-



plane in a sheltered area, refueling, resting and then preparing for service that evening. I visited eight new churches in one week, met Bible school students and preached a graduation in Boa Vista with Theresa. We also visited churches among two new Indian tribes where our workers built churches. We were met by some of our happy church people of the Kanamari Indian tribe at Flechal on the narrow Xeruá River, where we dedicated their new church on December 14th. 2013.—**Bennie** and **Theresa DeMerchant**

INDIA: Pradeep grew up in a Hindu family. His father died while he was still a child, and then his two older sisters died when he was in grade 5. All this brought mental health problems to his mother. She would grow violent, quarrel with neighbors, and the family had no peace. They prayed to their gods and got no relief. His mother was then admitted to a district medical college, which tried various treatments, but she was not healed and in fact grew worse. The doctors could only say that she would need medication for the rest of her life. Then an apostolic Christian pastor fasted and prayed for their mother and she was wonderfully healed. As a result, the family came to Christ as well. Pradeep received the Holy Spirit, was baptized and started attending Scism Christian University. After graduating, he now pastors in his home state.—Stan Scism
