Solar Electricity in Nicaragua

There is a need for the purchase of solar electrical systems for some of the churches in remote mountain or jungle regions of Nicaragua where electricity is currently unavailable.

These systems will provide a renewable source of electricity for the church and parsonage, providing lights, and power for a sound system and musical equipment. The system cost is estimated at approximately \$1,500.00.

A church called "Santa Fe del Caracol" held a three day revival, where twenty-one received the Holy Ghost and several were baptized in a creek. They borrowed a gas generator for the revival, but they would greatly benefit to have their own solar electricity. People walked up to eight hours one-way to come to these revivals.
