


Update from the Barkleys

Brother Elías Huitraigueo

One of our promising young preachers, Brother Elías Huitraiqueo, went to Colombia to be married, with plans to return to Chile after the

wedding. After the Civil Ceremony, but before the church ceremony, he was stricken with the virus and immediately taken to the hospital. The lack of adequate facilities kept him from being properly treated and he died while there. It was a tremendous blow to the work. His death in Colombia presented the problem of bringing him back to Chile for burial. There were many, many difficulties due the cost, customs and health ministries in the two countries. At every turn, there was a closed door. But every time a door closed, God made another way. After a series of miraculous events, we were finally able put Elías to rest near his family in Temuco.

Normally, I would not include a story like this in my newsletter. I don't like to magnify the negative. But I have related this incredible story to show that, it does not matter what the situation is. God IS IN CONTROL and we can trust Him to always come through for us.

The old song is true, "Tis so sweet to trust in Jesus; just to take Him at His Word."
